WEEK REPORT

2018-08-06 to 2018-08-12

Amherst Police responded to 94 complaints.

Monday:

Police received multiple reports of vehicles broken into. Incidents occurred on Westminster Avenue, Rupert Street and Melrose Street. Various monies, a wallet, a Samsung S5 Neo cellphone was stolen from the vehicles. Officers are looking into the incidents and are asking residents to report any suspicious persons who appear to be moving in and around vehicles late at night.

Officers received a complaint of uttering threats. The threats were from a male youth and directed towards another youth. The threats were received through various social media platforms. Police are investigating the incident.

Tuesday:

A 42 year old male was charged with failing to comply with an undertaking after the male was not at his residence after police conducted a curfew check. The incident occurred at a home on Belmont Street and charges are pending.

A three vehicle motor vehicle collision was reported near the intersection of East Victoria Street and Abbey Road. A vehicle travelling east on East Victoria Street had slowed down to do a right hand turn onto Abbey Road. A vehicle behind this vehicle slowed down but was hit from behind by a third vehicle. The force of the impact caused the second vehicle to collide into the first vehicle. Some vehicles had to be towed from the scene. No life threatening injuries were reported.

Wednesday:

A 22 year old male was charged with breaching his undertaking after police were notified that the male was inside a store which he was prohibited from entering. An officer attended the store and found the male inside. The male was arrested and released on a Promise to Appear in Court on August 13th for plea.

Officers were called to a Robert Angus Drive store after receiving reports that a female had stolen shoes, clothing and jewellery from the location. The female left the store prior to police arrival and patrols failed to locate her. The suspect had been approached by a lost prevention officer before fleeing the area in a beige coloured older model Honda Civic. Police are investigating.

Thursday:

Officers responded to reports of a break and enter in progress at a Croft Street residence. Officers attended and spoke to two males who were found a short distance from the home. It appears that the males were at the residence but there was no signs of entry into the home. No arrests were made at this time however police are still investigating the incident.

A female reported that her cellphone was stolen from the locker room of the YMCA. The phone is described as an iPhone 8 with a pink and grey case. Officers are reviewing the incident.

Friday:

A 37 year old male is facing two counts of uttering threats after an incident on Prince Arthur Street. The male threatened to kill two individuals during a dispute. The male was arrested by police on August 12th. He was later released on a Promise to Appear in Court on September 24th for plea.

Police were called to a Copp Avenue residence after reports of a female smashing windows at a home. The female, age 24 years was transported to the Cumberland Regional Health Care Centre for cuts to her hands. The matter is still under investigation.

Saturday:

A vehicle was broken into a Fullerton Street. Stolen from the vehicle was two wallets. Police are investigating.

Officers attended a noise complaint on Summit Avenue. The resident complied with officer's demands to keep the noise level down. Police would like to remind residents that they could face a charge of mischief or a charge under the Protection of Property Act for loud noise levels at any time of the day.

Sunday:

A male was reported to be smashing a chair outside a Prince Arthur Street residence. Officers spoke to the male and calmed things down. They were unable to determine who owned the property. The matter resulted in no arrests at this time.

Officers were called to a North Adelaide residence after reports of a disturbance. Police discovered that there was an argument between a male and a female however it was verbal only. The male was asked to leave the residence and he complied. No charges were laid in the incident.
