WEEK REPORT

2018-11-12 to 2018-11-18

Amherst Police responded to 101 complaints.

Monday:

A resident from Agnew Street reported her tires were slashed and her vehicle was keyed. Police are investigating the incident.

Police responded to a report of three dogs attacking a smaller dog on Park Street. The small dog had been tied to a leash in its owner's yard when attacked.

Officers attended the scene. The dogs became aggressive towards them and had to be OC sprayed to keep from biting. The dogs were eventually corralled in a makeshift fenced area. They were aggressive for several hours after the incident.

The small dog died of its injuries at the scene.

Four dogs were seized by the Animal Control Officer and police are still investigating the incident.

Tuesday:

A break and enter was reported at a business on Chandler Road. It is unknown if anything was taken in the incident. Police are investigating.

A 42-year-old male and a 33-year-old male are facing charges of theft from a Robert Angus Drive store. The males were involved in allegedly stealing electronics from the business. No court date has been set.

Wednesday:

A report of inappropriate touching was reported at a South Albion Street business. Police are investigating.

Officers are investigating an indecent act that occurred inside a business on Church Street. No charges have been laid at this time but the matter is still being looked into.

Thursday:

Police were called to respond to a shoplifting incident at a South Albion Street store. A female was arrested after it was reported she had taken over \$200 of items from the store without paying. The 38-year-old female will have the matter dealt with through Restorative Justice.

Two garages were broken into on Church Street. The suspect had rummaged through one vehicle in one garage before kicking the door to the next-door neighbour's garage. The suspect then attempted to steal a vehicle, however, the vehicle did not have a battery in it. The homeowner confronted the male who fled the area towards the Church Street soccer fields.

Police made several patrols of the area but did not locate the suspect.

Friday:

Police received a call about an abandoned vehicle in the Atlantic Superstore parking lot. It was discovered the vehicle had been stolen from the Tatamagouche area. Officers are investigating.

Officers responded to a shoplifting incident at a Robert Angus Drive business. A female is alleged to have stolen an item from the store before leaving the area. Charges are pending in the incident.

Saturday:

APD members received a report that an assault occurred at a Dickey Street residence. A male is alleged to have assaulted another tenant at the property. No arrests have been made but the matter is still under investigation.

Police are investigating a report of a theft from an Anson Avenue residence. The victim reported that his PlayStation 4 had been stolen from his home. He also reported that a male suspect in the incident had also assaulted him a week prior. The investigation continues.

Sunday:

Officers were notified of a pedestrian nearly being hit in the parking lot of the South Albion Street Irving. A pedestrian was walking across the parking lot when a vehicle reversed and accelerated at a high rate of speed. The vehicle nearly struck the pedestrian who had to dive out of the way. The vehicle was described as a burgundy SUV. The male driver is described as wearing an orange long-sleeve shirt and jeans. Police are investigating.

APD responded to an alarm at a South Albion Street business. Officers discovered an open door and what appeared to be footprints around the property. Subsequent patrols located a male two blocks from the business. The male's footwear matched the footprints left near the business. The male was not arrested but the investigation into the matter is ongoing.
