Amherst Police responded to 46 complaints over a three-day period

Tuesday:

Police responded to reports of a disturbance in the Victoria Street area. A male and a female were reported to be involved in an altercation. Subsequent investigation led to the arrest of a 38-year-old female for assault. She was later released on a promise to appear in court on April 1 for plea.

Wednesday:

Police recovered a stolen vehicle in the parking lot of a Victoria Street business. The vehicle was stolen from the Springhill area. Investigation into the matter is ongoing.

Amherst police attended a Clinton Street residence after reports of a break and enter in progress. A male and a female were found inside the residence and arrested.

During the arrest, the female allegedly assaulted one of the police officers. The 26-year-old female is facing charges of break and enter, assaulting a police officer, uttering threats and failing to comply with conditions of an undertaking.

The male, 31, has been charged with break and enter and failure to comply with a probation order. Both subjects were held in custody until they appeared in court on March 21.

Both were released on a judge's undertaking and will next appear in court on April 29.

Thursday:

Amherst Police responded to reports that a female was assaulted by a male near Spring Street. The male is alleged to have punched and kicked the female. The male and female are known to each other. The male has not been located by police but officers are currently looking for him for questioning. The investigation into the matter is ongoing.

A 59-year-old male is facing charges of interfering with a criminal justice witness after it was alleged he attempted to get the person to drop charges on another matter. The male was arrested at a Copp Avenue building while officers were there for a landlord-tenant incident. The male is slated to appear in Amherst provincial court on April 29 for plea.

...

A 55-year-old female was charged with impaired driving after reports were received that alleged had she left an Amherst business while impaired. Officers made patrols for the vehicle shortly after receiving the report and found the vehicle at the female's home. The female was administered a roadside screening device test, which she failed. The female subsequently provided two samples of her breath, which showed she was over the legal limit. She was released on a promise to appear in court on April 29 for plea.

A 28-year-old female was charged with breach of an undertaking after she allegedly attended a Clinton Street residence that she was prohibited from attending. The female had been released by a judge earlier in the day on conditions. Officers located the female walking on Church Street and she was arrested. She was held in custody until the morning of March 22.

...

A 21-year-old male is facing charges of assault, mischief, possession of a weapon, three counts of uttering threats and two breaches of an undertaking after an incident at a Willow Street residence.

The male is alleged to have gotten into a confrontation with another male after the male criticized him on his treatment of his dog. After the altercation, the male allegedly uttered several threats to kill and damage property. The male also allegedly damaged a wall at the home. Sometime during the incident, the male allegedly brandished a knife. Police arrested the male and he was held for court on March 22.

Police attended a South Albion Street liquor store after receiving a call that a male had allegedly stolen alcohol from the business. Investigation into the matter led to the identity of the male. The male was arrested without incident at his Dickey Street home. He is facing charges of theft, breach of his curfew conditions and breach of his conditions to not possess or consume alcohol. He was held in custody until he saw a judge on March 22.
