WEEK REPORT

2019-05-20 to 2019-05-26

Amherst Police responded to 91 complaints.

Monday:

A youth was arrested for public intoxication after he was found drunk and sleeping outside a Central Avenue residence. The youth was transported to cells until he was sober and issued a ticket for underage drinking.

Police received a call about a male who allegedly shoplifted from a South Albion Street store. The male was then reported to have attempted stealing a food item from a second store. The male left the area prior to police arrival. Officers are reviewing surveillance tapes in hopes of identifying the male.

Tuesday:

A vehicle was reported stolen from the Amherst Centre Mall parking lot. The vehicle was described as a grey 2013 Mazda 3 with Nova Scotia licence plate GDD157. Police are investigating.

A male was accused of sending multiple harassing texts and phone calls to two females. Officers spoke to the male and warned him of his actions. No charges were laid at this time.

Wednesday:

A 27-year-old male was charged with five counts of breaching two court orders, as well as single counts each of failing to appear and possession of a Schedule 1 opioid after an incident on Liberty Lane.

The male was reported to have been intoxicated at a residence, which was contrary to his conditions. The male was held in custody and appeared in court on May 23. He pleaded guilty to two breaches. The rest of the charges were withdrawn. The male was then placed on a conditional sentence order.

A resident on Longleah Court reported that his trailer was damaged in a hit and run.

The trailer, which was parked in the front yard of the property, suffered a deep gash on the side wall of the trailer. The damage possibly occurred sometime overnight on May 21-May 22.

Officers are investigating the incident.

Thursday:

Police responded to a Liberty Lane residence after reports of a disturbance between two males.

A male was reported to have attempted to fight with a second male before leaving the scene. Officers are aware of the identity of the second male.

No charges have been laid at this time.

Police were dispatched to a disturbance at an East Victoria Street area home. A male and a female were arguing at the residence. Officers observed several items inside the home had been thrown around.

The female continued yelling and screaming while officers were at the scene. She was eventually arrested for breach of the peace, but was later released without any charges.

The female was allowed to gather up some belongings, and the two were separated to keep the peace.

Friday:

Police were asked to remove a guest that was causing issues at a local motel. A male and female were removed from the motel without any problems.

A female youth was reported missing from an Amherst residence. Officers made patrols for the female. It was discovered that she had returned home on her own.

Saturday:

Besides two major motor vehicle collisions during the course of the day, APD officers responded to reports that a male had communicated with a female at the Beacon Street Park, contrary to her conditions. Officers are investigating.

An officer attended a Spring Street residence after a disturbance was noted to be taking place.

The landlord of the property had refused access to a tenant who wanted to remove property from the location. The landlord said the tenant had moved out.

The tenant was allowed access to remove some property. He was then given notice barring him from the location.

Sunday:

Officers received a report of a hit and run in the Walmart parking lot.

A red Mazda 3 was observed by witnesses backing into a vehicle before leaving the scene.

Officers have the licence plate of the suspect vehicle and will be following up on the matter.

No charges have been laid at this time.

A resident on Willow Street reported that a necklace had been stolen. The necklace is described as being 23-inches long, with white and yellow gold alternating links. The necklace has the words "Turkey" engraved on it.

Police are looking into the matter.
